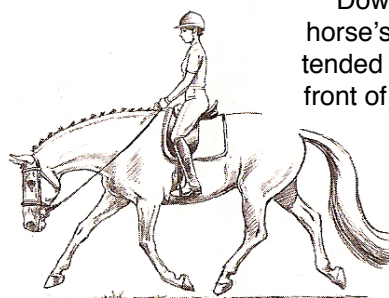

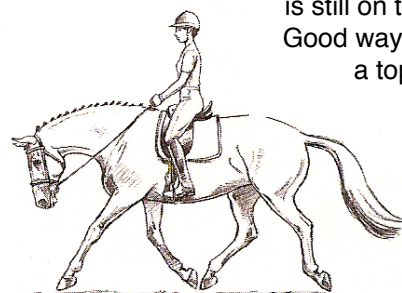

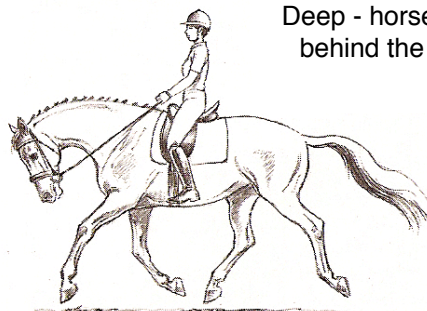
"Down & out," -

1. Stretching



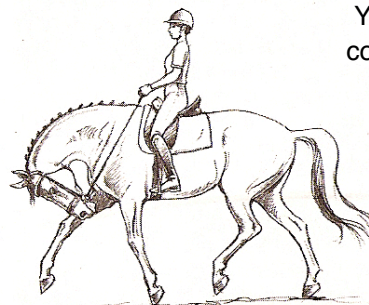
"Down & round," horse
